Investigative Bible Study

Five Studies Introducing Christian Faith

There are many resources to help people explore Christian faith. Alpha Canada has excellent resources and training. Their model of outreach includes relationship building through invitation, hospitality, and prayer. Another resource that I enjoy, is 'Christianity Explored' which communicates the gospel in clear and concise terms. However, I put together a simple resource based on my own experience in meeting with people who wanted to learn more about Christianity. I wonder if it might be helpful.


The first session looks at the *Parable of the Prodigal (or Lost) Son* in Luke 15. This is a beautiful story that highlights the depth of God's love. One of the discoveries in this parable is that the younger son and the older son are actually similar. They're relationship with their father is based on entitlement and merit. But God's love is based entirely on grace. This means that we can do nothing to increase or improve God's love for us and for the world. It is a deep and abiding love. Other sessions include scripture passages such as Isaiah 53 and John 1.

Recently, we had the privilege to welcome new Christians into God's family. We studied these passages together and invited them to make a profession of faith. It was all about God's grace in their lives and ours.

Personal Reflections on Ministry in the Neighbourhood

"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

Hebrews 4:16 ESV



Ministry in the neighbourhood is a challenge. It's a challenge to live by faith every day. It's a challenge to walk with people through their struggles. It's a challenge to be present in the ups and downs of relationships.

Since I started serving with Flow Ministries over a year ago, my constant prayer has been "Lord, have mercy." When I visit with people in the neighbourhood, "Lord, have mercy." When I make a phone call reaching out to someone, "Lord, have mercy." When volunteers and neighbours work together on a program or event, "Lord, have mercy." When doors are open or doors are closed, "Lord, have mercy."

I believe that God is truly merciful. I believe that God hears and answers prayer. Over the past few months, we've seen God's mercy at work.

In our youth mentoring, a mentee had stopped coming to our sessions. We had met several times and I felt like we had a good connection. But there was a traumatic event that happened in his family life. As a result, we lost contact with him for a few months. A couple weeks ago, by God's grace, I had a chance to talk with him briefly. I told him that we miss him at mentoring, and we want him to be part of our group again. But I also said that we wouldn't push him because we care for him. I don't know where this will lead, but I trust that God continues to answer prayer.

In our house church, we met an Iranian lady who told us that she wanted to become a Christian. As a result, one of our volunteers and I began meeting with her and her daughter. We went through a series of five Bible passages introducing the Christian faith. At the end of our study, both the mom and daughter professed their faith in Jesus Christ. It was amazing to see them thinking through scripture and coming to a clearer understanding of their faith. It was a blessing. We continue to support both mom and daughter. We don't know where this will lead, but we are praying for more open doors for the gospel.

We recently held a Donor & Volunteer Thank-You Dinner. We reached out to people who had given in many ways over the past year. We invited people in the neighbourhood, some who were donors and volunteers themselves. We had a beautiful evening together to enjoy each other's company, eat together, and offer thanksgiving to God. It is God's mercy that allowed things to work out. But even when things don't go according to our plans, thank God for his mercy!

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. (2 Corinthians 5:18).







Flow Volunteer Retreat, October 2023

This week, I drove people around. On Monday, a neighbour needed a ride to an appointment at the hospital. On Tuesday and Wednesday, another neighbour needed a ride to the courthouse in Oshawa. On Friday, another neighbour needed a ride to a funeral service in Alliston. To be honest, I don't always see the ministry value in these kinds of things. Is this good use of my time? Could I or should I be doing something else? It's possible. But then I am reminded that I am called to live a life of love in the neighbourhood and to inspire others to do the same, in Jesus' name. It is a ministry of presence and a ministry of reconciliation that is not glamorous. But walking with people in their need, leads to conversations in the car, which leads to prayers of hope, which leads to greater faith for all of us.

Henri Nouwen wrote a book called Gracias!, a devotional journey of his six-month trip to Bolivia and Peru. Here's a beautiful quote about the ministry of presence: "More and more, the desire grows in me simply to walk around, greet people, enter their homes, sit on their doorsteps, play ball, throw water, and be known as someone who wants to live with them. It is a privilege to have the time and the freedom to practice this simple ministry of presence. Still, it is not as simple as it seems. My own desire to be useful, to do something significant, or to be part of some impressive project is so strong that soon my time is taken up by meetings, conferences, study groups, and workshops that prevent me from walking the streets. It is difficult not to have plans, not to organize people around an urgent cause, and not to feel that you are working directly for social progress. But I wonder more and more if the first thing shouldn't be to know people by name, to eat and to drink with them, to listen to their stories and tell your own, and to let them know with words, handshakes, and hugs that you do not simply like them, but truly love them." (Nouwen 1983, 147).

On Sunday, after house church, another neighbour asked me to go with her to the hospital when she needed to help an estranged family member. I said, "Yes, I will go with you." I don't know where this will lead but God certainly does!

Sometimes, describing mentoring is a funny thing. "What do you guys do with the kids?" people ask me. It's hard to give one short answer - we just hang out, do whatever the kids want to do, which can mean eating, going to the mall, or playing at the park.

Regardless of what we do, the "what" is not as important as the "why". Mentoring is so purposeful for me because of the opportunity to share God's love with these kids, being able to support the next generation.

God has shown me a broader understanding of how love manifests in this ministry. Some days have super active, light-hearted conversations, others more somber. Some days where the kids have tons of energy to burn, some where we're sitting in a car for a while.

Either way, we are there, present and intentional with our mentees, seeing where we can encourage, teach, or simply hear them out. As they grow and we journey with our mentees, we navigate different topics, talking about how to understand the world and tackle its challenges.

I'm lucky to be part of these conversations and participate in their curiosities and excitement in life. Sometimes I forget the funny perspectives and insight kids have! The ability to share about God with them, to love them, and to enjoy experiences together is what keeps me looking forward to each meeting.



I first came to know Flow through a call for mentors around 10 years ago. By chance, I heard of Flow starting a mentoring ministry and brought it to my church, in the hope of mobilizing the youths to become mentors. After acquainting with the Flow leaders, I was invited to become a coach for the mentors. As I had never been a Flow mentor before, I doubted how I could become a coach for the mentors, so I asked to be assigned to mentor two young adults who were mentally challenged while I served on the coaching team.

At the time I was already wearing multiple hats in ministries at my church. I have to confess my fear and hesitation toward the commitment to meeting up with the mentees at least twice a week and a commitment of at least 2 years. However, after much prayer, the Spirit moved me to take the challenge.

Proverbs 11:25 - Whoever brings blessing will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered.

Fast track forward, today I no longer serve in the mentoring ministry but am a member of the Flow board with regular weekly activities at Kin Village.

For many years, I have been serving the Kin Village community by shopping for their groceries, applying for government subsidies, planning for daily care they need, and praying with them when facing stress.

It is such a privilege when others "allow" you into their lives. At Kin Village, I have encountered both Christians and non-Christians, yet I am accepted with openness just the same. Many of them consider me a family member. However, I always feel that I am the most blessed through it all.

Through caring for and loving people at Kin Village, as well as many Christian volunteers serving alongside, I have received much care and prayers in return. Most important of all, through authentic life interactions depending on the Holy Spirit, in good and bad times, Christ has become so much more "in-person" to me.



God Behind the Scenes

Since the beginning of this year, Pastor Brian had been praying for opportunities to meet new neighbours living at Kin Village and Trinity Square. Then one day in June, Brian received a random



call from an elderly couple living in Kin Village asking for help to move from their home on the second floor to a ground floor unit. The couple got Brian's number from a neighbour connected with Flow Ministries.

When Brian went to visit the couple, he found that they had quite a bit of stuff. He worried about how to move everything, including some of the items that were quite bulky. Brian turned to God in prayer, asking for wisdom and guidance.

He also reached out to a few groups to see if they could come help; one group responded saying they have 20 people that are ready to serve.



On one of the

initial days of the move, Brian arrived with a small team of Mercy Rain volunteers and found that most of the items, especially the bulky ones, had already been moved into the new unit. Apparently, the son of the couple brought together a group of friends to help move things during the Canada Day long weekend. Because of this, Brian called the group of 20 people to tell them that they were no longer needed.

As there were not a lot of items left to move, God created space for Brian to have spiritual conversations with the couple and to pray for them. This event taught Brian to learn to trust in God and His plans, knowing that He is always working behind the scenes.



HANGERS & HANGOUT

Last year, we created hangers to help promote the Stream Mentoring program and hosted a one-day event to hang them on the doors of the neighbours in Kin Village and Trinity Square. Because of the pandemic, we passively went around the neighbourhood



doing it. Although we had a wonderful time, we did not receive any interest in our mentoring program.



This year, Jess created an event over two Saturday mornings in July called "Hangers & Hangout" to actively go door to door to meet neighbours. With over

300 homes to cover, this

event could not have happened without the help of one-time volunteers who came out with enthusiasm to serve.

As we went around, some neighbours welcomed us with big smiles as we shared about the mentoring program and told us how they wish their child was old enough



to participate. There were others, however, who blatantly told us that they did not want anything to do with us when they saw the cross and knew we were Christians. Although we had various responses,

God answered our prayers by having four new mentees sign up on the spot for our program!

We are excited for these new mentees (3 boys and 1 girl) to have the opportunity to hear the good news of Jesus Christ. However, for them to start the program, they need mentors to journey with them. In honesty, we are lacking male mentors



to serve alongside us. Please join us in praying, as the Lord provided us with new mentees, that He will also bring the right mentors to mentor them.

The Time is NOW!

By now, we have all been in this pandemic for two years. Some of us may be tired of wearing face masks every time we leave the home. Others may be struggling with loneliness for not being able to gather with loved ones regularly. With new variants of COVID-19 emerging almost every season, we may wonder if our lives will ever get back to a time before lockdowns, social distancing, and vaccine passports were a thing.



Even if the world around us may feel like it is in a standstill, we—Christians—must remain faithful and diligent in carrying out the Great Commission that Jesus commanded. He said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:18-20).

At Flow Ministries, the work of ministering to the materially poor and sharing the gospel with the lost continues. Government restrictions cannot dampen our serving spirits. Even if it means hosting mentoring sessions online or shortening our visitations with the neighbours at Kin Village, we believe everyone needs to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ and receive Him as their personal Lord and Saviour. No matter what our circumstances are, we can always count on the fact that Jesus is with us to the end of the age.











We believe the time to volunteer and serve the Lord is now—not when things finally return to "normal"—but NOW! Hence, we created a new position to help equip our volunteers to have the most impact. After serving one year as the interim Stream Mentoring Program Director, we hired Dr. Jess Wan-Wong as our official Stream Mentoring Program Director. Additionally, she will be our Volunteer Coordinator, where she will be in charge of onboarding, training, and follow-up with each volunteer.

Would you take some time *right now* to pray, asking the Lord how He may be calling you to serve in His kingdom? Whether or not He lays Flow Ministries on your heart, we pray that you would join Jesus's Great Commission. This pandemic cannot hold us back from being His hands and feet to the broken and lost world.

Christmas a Flow





Before COVID-19, we would traditionally host a Christmas Service for all the neighbours and mentees at Kin Village. It was a wonderful time of worshipping the Lord, building gingerbread houses, and fellowshipping over food. 

Some had pretty designs while others wrote words such as love, joy, peace, and hope—a message that our world desperately needs.

A HEART OF Blessing

Another tradition at Flow Ministries is our annual Christmas Hamper Program. It is a practical way to build relationships with the families in Kin Village by presenting them with a gift to meet their needs during the holiday season and taking the opportunity to share the good news of Jesus Christ. Through the Hamper Program, we hope to tangibly show how our Father in heaven provides for us by helping to meet the needs of the neighbours.

We had 16 households that signed up for hampers and 13 groups of donors—made up of churches, families, and individuals. With 13 donor groups helping 16 households, some of our donors gave generously to bless more than one household.

With one particular family that Pastor Brian called asking whether or not they would like a hamper, the mother answered saying that they needed one. Then, she shared that when she told her daughter about Flow Ministries' Christmas Hamper Program, she hopes one day, when they are in a better financial situation, that they can help others in the same way that they have been helped—what a testimony of God working in the lives of the neighbours in Kin Village to cultivate a heart of blessing others as they have been blessed!





HELPING WITHOUT HURTING

How can we help the materially poor without hurting them and ourselves? This January we launched a book study over Zoom on Steve Corbett and Brian Fikkert's When Helping Hurts: How to Alleviate Poverty Without Hurting the Poor...and Yourself. Our 7-week session studied Corbett and Fikkert's theological framework and practical approach to ministering to the poor. The authors define poverty not as a lack of material things,

but of brokenness in relationship with God, self, others, and the

rest of creation.

Each week, participants watched a video and engaged in a lively discussion led by Pastor Brian and Jess. Much time was spent reflecting on how we—as individuals and the church—respond to the materially poor and whether or not what we did was actually helping or exasperating the problem. In other words, are we treating the underlying issue that is causing poverty or are we just covering what we see on the surface with a band-aid?



The reality is that we and the materially poor are not all that different. The problems that we face may differ slightly, but the solution to them is the same—we all need Jesus. The ultimate truth is "Jesus Christ transforms both of us . . . Poverty alleviation is about walking side by side, hand in hand, and saying 'I'm broken, you're broken' but Jesus Christ can show up and bring healing to both of us." We are excited to apply what we learned from Corbett and Fikkert to our ministry work at Kin Village.














Stream Mentoring's Winning T-Shirt Design

Additionally, this event showed that serving in Flow Ministries does not have to be an individual endeavour—a whole family can be involved! Would you consider how you could also include your family members in the ministries that you serve in?

Staying Faithful to God's Work

In all honesty, our extended stay-at-home order has been trying at Flow Without Bounds Ministries. To say that pandemic fatigue has not settled into some of our staff, volunteers, and attendees is a lie. Some of us are drained from having too much screen-time, others are discouraged with how long COVID-19 has been around for and wonder whether we will ever reach a state of "normal" again. Despite our circumstances, Galatians 6:9 reminds us, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Our government restrictions cannot dampen the serving spirit at Flow Ministries and we faithfully press on with the work that God entrusted us to do.

Our volunteers in Mercy Rain maintain their essential service of bringing groceries to vulnerable neighbours in Kin Village. Some neighbours living in isolation expressed their struggle with loneliness, and we are looking forward to offering some comfort to these neighbours through music therapy, as one of our volunteers is a registered music therapist. At Lighthouse, we gather to worship together over Zoom on Sunday afternoons. Pastor Brian recently finished a series on the book of Proverbs and is starting a study on discipleship. One of our board members, Nelson, also had the opportunity to preach his first sermon at Lighthouse on God's instructions to Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac. In our bi-monthly Prayer Summit, we bring our requests before God; at one meeting, we prayed for the Lord's working in each neighbour by name who received a Hamper over Christmas.



Mentors testing an online platform

We hosted our first online workshop taught by our interim Stream Mentoring Program Director, Jess (more on this story in page 2). With Stream Mentoring, some mentors were able to meet with their mentees in-person before the stay-at-home order moved everything online. To keep mentoring sessions engaging, some mentors came together to test an online gaming platform. As the province opens up soon, Jess created a COVID-19 guideline for mentors to follow when they meet their mentees.

Pastor Brian is working on building partnerships with churches around the Kin Village area. So far, we have received positive feedback from pastors, and are super excited to have new faces join our team! As the warmer weather rolls in and more people are vaccinated, we cannot wait to gather in-person again!

FEARLESSLY Share the Gospel

This May, Flow Ministries put together its first webinar titled, "Practice Makes Perfect: How to FEARLESSLY Share the Gospel." With close to 50 participants, it was an insightful time as Jess taught on practical evangelism, and interactive as the participants were able to dialogue with one another during breakout rooms.



Jess posed some questions as polls for the participants to give their anonymous response. One of the questions was, "About how often, if at all, do you personally pray for opportunities to tell others about Jesus?" Jess compared the results of the participants with a survey done in 2019 by Lifeway Research and found similarities. The majority, about 39% and 27% respectively, have never or rarely prayed for opportunities to tell others about Jesus. Jess challenged the participants to write down names of five unbelievers that they can start praying for.

Everyday	
A few times a week	
Once a week	
A few times a month	
Once a month	
Rarely/Never	39%

Probably the most convicting part of the workshop was when Jess said, "Before we pray for unbelievers and opportunities, maybe we need to be praying for our own hearts, honestly confessing to God that we do not care as much as we should about people who do not yet know the Lord."

One practical takeaway was, "Preach the gospel to yourself

every day! The more familiar we are with the gospel message, the more deeply we recognize the significance of the gospel in our life, and the more comfortable we will be when we share the gospel." While it is ultimately the work of the Spirit that moves a person to profess faith in Jesus Christ, we are all called to be faithful messengers of the gospel. Jess concluded, "We can fearlessly share the gospel when we commit to preach the gospel to

ourselves daily, pray for opportunities to witness to an unbeliever, and surrender the outcome to God."

What is Flow Ministries? Moving Forward in 2021

2020 was a year of transitioning, learning, and growing for Flow Without Bounds Ministries. For a man who enjoys stability, Pastor Brian, the Executive Director and Lead Pastor of Flow, was constantly adjusting to change. Looking back at what made 2020 a memorable year, Brian credits it to the faithfulness of the volunteers who continued to be the hands and feet of Jesus as well as the generosity of the donors who gave selflessly from their own resources for the neighbours at Kin Village—THANK YOU!













As Brian considers the work of Flow, he narrows it down to the ministry of presence and the ministry of practical help. Through Steve Corbett and Brian Fikkert's book When Helping Hurts, Brian learned that poverty is not defined as a lack of material things, but of brokenness in relationship with God, self, others, and the rest of creation. The authors explain, "Poverty alleviation is the ministry of reconciliation: moving people closer to glorifying God by living in right relationship with God, with self, with others, and with the rest of creation." At Flow, we seek to bring healing in these broken relationships through the power and the good news of Jesus Christ to the neighbours of Kin Village (see diagram on bottom of page 2 for a detailed explanation). Although we may bring temporary relief through physical resources, we want to impart what will make the lasting impact in these neighbour's lives—as well as our own—which is Jesus Christ, the hope of glory.



With the years to come, Brian hopes that Flow not only ministers to the neighbours, but with the neighbours of Kin Village. As these neighbours become transformed by the gospel truth, may they also be a part of bringing *shalom* to the community.







Introducing Our New Director @ Stream

Stream Mentoring is a unique program where Christian mentors intentionally share biblical truths with their non-Christian mentees as they journey together week after week. The hope is not only for these mentees to be transformed by Jesus Christ, but also for those around them to notice this change and, Lord willing, become transformed by Jesus too.

Over the past year, a lack of direction and staffing changes left Stream at a standstill. As Flow looked for ways to revamp Stream, they hired Dr. Jessica Wan as their Interim Stream Mentoring Program Director. Jess is no stranger at Stream; she has been actively serving as a mentor for almost three years and had been a mentor coach for a year. She holds a Ph.D. in Church Music with a concentration in music ministry and

a minor in women's ministry from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (Fort Worth, TX).



During Jess's interim post (February 2021–January 2022), she aims to create a holistic program, where the emphasis is on volunteers growing closer to God as they serve. Her work will primarily consist of developing training materials to equip mentors and mentor coaches in the areas of spiritual formation, evangelism, and administration. Of

these three areas, Jess believes the most important is spiritual formation, and intends on placing a focus on spiritual growth during regular meetings with the mentors and mentor coaches. Additionally, she will be connecting with local churches to recruit new volunteers.

Jess's passion to invest in the next generation stems from her personal desire to be mentored when she was a teenager, but she did not have the opportunity until she was an adult. The wisdom and guidance that she received from godly mentors deeply impacted her walk with Jesus, and she prays she could do the same for others too.

IT TAKES ONE BODY

Last November, Pastor Brian and his wife connected personally with neighbours at Kin Village to inquire whether their family



needed a hamper. With one particular home that they visited, they were greeted by a friendly elderly couple. Brian asked whether the lady of the house was home, but the elderly woman responded in Chinese. Brian tried asking again, and the elderly woman continued in Chinese. The exchange went on for a while, but ultimately went nowhere as Brian did not know Chinese and the elderly couple did not know English. Determined to serve and bless this family, Brian and his wife returned week after week only to encounter that same lovely couple again and again.

Providence came when a small group from a church near Kin Village emailed Brian of their interest in Flow's Christmas Hamper Program. Knowing the small group was from a Chinese church, Brian asked the group leader if anyone in her group knew how to speak Cantonese or Mandarin, as Brian was not sure what language the elderly couple spoke. The group leader



said she was fluent in both, then Brian told her he had the perfect neighbour for them to provide a hamper for—the Chinese family. The small group leader gave the family a

call and was able to confirm items that they needed. Within a week, the hamper was assembled and ready for delivery. Looking back, Brian thought this neighbour was going to be the last family to receive a hamper, but they ended up being the first ones in the neighbourhood to receive it.

There is a saying that goes, "It takes a village to raise a child." Likewise in ministry, "It takes one Body to reach a neighbour." It is amazing to witness through the Hamper Program the coming together of Christian brothers and sisters to serve our neighbour.
