Hello,

It has been a while. I'm still alive! And still in my (less) new HR role. And still juggling like every working mom.

The longer I'm in this role, the more I realize that so much of Personnel work is not something I can disclose openly, especially in a medium like this. Details can only be anonymized so much before things become vague and meaningless, generic reports of "God showed up!" It has made writing these prayer letters well more difficult than before. And yet there's so much I want to share! Somewhat mysteriously, I can only ask that you pray for us as we employ our skills, knowledge, and care to exploring how our Canadian team can serve better together in fellowship. And as always, please pray for those who are partway through our candidate process for serving overseas. Oh and please don't forget our workers who have been patiently waiting to (finally) travel to their field or eagerly awaiting return.

In addition, rotating illnesses at Evan's daycare means that our whole family is in survival mode once every two weeks on average. OMF work gets done at odd, unpredictable hours, sometimes while a fevering child naps, sometimes while a grandma is serving up a snack or making cars out of play dough (to Evan's great delight). I'm just about ready to start a friendly game of "Working Parent Bingo" to remember to laugh. Some days are long, friends.

But the years are certainly short. Just like that, Evan is nearly 2.5 years old. Just like that, we were at the airport, seeing our friends and OMF colleagues fly out to Japan for long-term ministry, their 9-month-old baby in tow. Just like that, 2022 is off the calendar, and the murmuring of Spring's arrival is on the wind (and in the official announcements that yet again, it's almost time to turn the clocks forward).

We are immensely grateful for the big and small ways God has shown up for us as a family trying to ride out wave after wave of illness. Especially when Alwin travels for work and I'm going solo. Our hearts and souls are full of reminders of God's love when we are (miraculously!) healthy and able to share a meal with friends. We are so grateful for coworkers, friends, and family who offer timely food, medication, childcare, compassion, encouragement. They look at us through eyes of grace and faith and love—cheering for us, hoping for us, praying for us, when we are too exhausted or unwell to do much other than push a toy car back and forth while lying on the floor. And only occasionally falling asleep.

We know that even in these days, a blur of weeks whipping off the calendar, unsure sometimes of how or where God is at work in the millionth load of laundry this week, or in the thousandth attempt (in vain) to teach Evan to say hello, or in being interrupted in the middle of a work day by the daycare with that dreaded photo of the thermometer reading 38.1°C

—these days too, the Lord has made.

And we are learning—slowly, if somewhat haltingly—to rejoice in them.

Please continue to pray for us as we continue to review and propose changes to policy (FPC) and pivot and communicate well as the pandemic progresses (CMT). We're all too aware of our limitations and very much need the Lord as we look for solutions and/or next steps.
- Adjustment to this HR role continues. On some days, I miss working closely with our Mobilization team. More and more, I'm growing in appreciation for belonging to a team, being supervised by someone who

has experience and expertise in the same area of work, and taking a more active role in effecting internal change. Thank you for praying for me, even though I haven't been able to share many of the details (unlike when I was in Comms)!

Alwin and I are routinely surprised by how our hearts fill with sudden joy, delight, and pride when watching Evan. The pandemic took much away from us as first-time parents, but enabled us to be continuously present for Evan's every milestone. It won't always be this way, and we are thankful for this season of closeness as a family.



Both of us were captivated by God's awesome creation: beautiful, rugged, wild. Such a humbling experience to wake up in the presence of these stone giants. It was a much-needed reminder that God is big-very very big-and his ways, mysterious as they are, are truly higher than ours.
- VISITING OLD FRIENDS: We recently returned from visiting some friends in the Atlantic. (Some of you may recognize them!) It was a joy to be with them again, catching up, meeting their new church community, and reconnecting with their daughter and granddaughter (they grow so fast!). The Sunday before we left, Alwin was asked to share his testimony and I was invited to sing with the worship team. Hello friend!

I hope this email finds you well! I'm happy to report that I'm sitting in the sun as I write this, and delighted that it almost feels uncomfortably warm. Ah yes, the

first tingles of Summer.

In this moment of quiet, I wanted to share something the pastoral teaching team at FAC has been leading us to reflect on in the past few weeks: the image of the river. It is mentioned in Ezekiel 47, when Ezekiel is given a vision of the temple. This trickle of water begins inside the temple, and with impossible speed, grows into a river so deep that Ezekiel could not cross. Then "the man" explains to Ezekiel that the river continues down to the Dead Sea where it will turn the saltwater to freshwater; everywhere this river flows, life will be found in abundance. Fruit trees will grow on both banks of this river, and will bear fruit every month of the year. Their leaves will not wither. Their fruit will be food and their leaves for healing.

In Jesus' words: "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." (John 7:37b-38)

In Revelation, the river is flowing through the city of God, and growing on both sides of it is the tree of life, which also yields fruit every month, and its leaves are also for healing.

I'll let the Holy Spirit say what he will to you. For me, it was reassuring and encouraging to be reminded that Christ, our living water, is a mighty river that flows unhindered and unstoppable—where we drink deeply of his mercy, love, goodness, grace, we can expect that he will strengthen us, grow us, bloom us, and bring healing through us.

Chiu on This

An invitation to reflect

I've begun to notice that every winter, sometime in mid-February, I wonder if spring will ever come again. It feels like it has been winter forever, and will continue to be winter forever. March feels like more of the same, and then, suddenly, April catches me by surprise with above-zero temperatures. The days grow longer, and I reach for one coat rather than two when I head out the door.

You'd think, after having experienced this dramatic turn of the seasons, for a few *decades* this would stop being a surprise. But when spring arrives, I'm always caught off guard. Rather than immediate excitement, I'm vexed and confused.

Do I wear boots or not? Is it going to rain or snow? Will I need a scarf and/or hat? How about gloves? Will a hoodie be warm enough?

Reflecting on this has surfaced two thoughts:


- Holding on to hope is challenging, even when you know that God's mercies are new every morning, when it's darkest before dawn
- We don't always thank God as he is answering our prayers, especially if his answer requires us to change.

As the days continue to warm up, I encourage you to ponder these questions with me:

- How is God teaching me to hold on to his hope? How is he using others to show me how to do that?
- How has God answered some of my prayers in astonishing ways? What are some things that I'm wrestling with, and is God using those to answer my own prayers?


 Future Fit: Remember that conference I wrote about last May? Many attendees walked away feeling like it was something we need to continue —we need churches, Christian schools, mission agencies, and professionals to gather to talk, share, pray, and discern where and how God is leading all of us in the future of mission. Consequently two teams have formed under the Future Fit "brand"—one to clarify the vision and DNA of Future Fit-type events, and another to provide support for event planners/coordinators who want to facilitate deep discussions across multiple Christian institutions.

I've been invited to join the implementation team, and after some consideration, have agreed—despite it not coming with a clear time commitment or job description. (Eep.) Being reminded lately that the "adventure-or-die" mindset often puts us in positions where we can't endlessly calculate the risks (and therefore mitigate them). Praying that when Future Fit stuff arises, God will give me the capacity to do this

work well!

- Volunteer onboarding: As I mentioned in my last letter, we had our first ever social media volunteers join the Comms team! Due to their full schedules, we can only meet once a week to run training. It's a sweet time for all of us. We do a quick check-in, pray for and with one another, and then move into the material. Preparing training materials brought back many memories of when I learned these things for the first time, when I first joined OMF. Hearing and seeing them grasp all the nuances and different layers of OMF comms reminds me too that God put a whole lot of teacher in me when he made me. Thanking God every time I see their faces light up as they grow in their confidence to do social media work.
- Candidate Course: I don't often stand up and give presentations or run training sessions, but once or twice a year we run a week-long course for serious inquirers at OMF. It's intense! People fly in from across the country to attend. I think of it as an immersive dip into the OMF community. Being the Comms Coordinator, it's my job to equip our potential future workers with a good communication toolbox, showcase the tools, and explain how/when best to use which. Even though I've done this for a few years now, I've never been happy with my session.

This year, I took to the International Comms community and asked for input—something I'd never done before because prior to last August, as I didn't know who was actually out there and whether or not they'd respond! Thankfully, some of my coworkers in the UK got back to me guickly; we met over video conference and now I have loads of high quality material to sift through and adapt. Yessss. Teamwork makes the dream work! Praying that the revamped Comms session will help better equip and train our workers on improved communication as they share stories of God's work in their lives and ministries with churches, friends, family, neighbours, etc.

Story time!

So it's February, and that usually means it's grey and wet. (I picked up a pair of knitting needles and just cast on something not knowing what I was actually knitting. It's *that* kind of weather.) Still, life goes on. At First Alliance, our February Owning the Impact meeting happened to land on a day when the forecast was so terrible the Toronto District School Board closed the schools, something they hadn't done since Feb 2, 2011 (February *again*). Pastor Tim and I had texts, emails, and phone calls back and forth—should we cancel the meeting? Should we not? There's snow! And ice! And wind! Isn't it time to call it quits when the precipitation is travelling horizontally rather than vertically?!

We didn't cancel. In the end, we simply felt that this meeting needed to happen on that day. We couldn't reschedule, and if we cancelled, the next time we met would've been in March—too late. So Tim ordered pizza, shovelled some of the front steps, set up the room, and picked up the pizza from the mall across the street; I showed up with my training materials and my eyelashes and eyebrows caked with sleet. (Our new office is just down the street from the church, so I walked.) Alwin brought books that I'd forgotten at home.

Then we waited.

Incredibly, *people showed up!* In the end, we totalled about 16 people, and we had a great time diving into leadership matters and learning together. And everyone got back home safely. Our hearts were full as we reflected on the adventures that God calls us on, and the way he waits patiently for us out on the water while we dither hither and thither. I personally felt like it was a litmus test, not about passing or failing but about substance or character—whom do I actually trust when the wind is howling? Who am I when the odds seem dismal? What guides or grounds me when every path looks uncertain?

My inner committee, motivated by fear, self-preservation, rationality, tends to be quite loud still, and silencing it requires heroic effort. I look forward to the day that the still small voice won't have to speak in the din of internal shouting. :)
