- 5. When coughing or sneezing, please cover your mouth and nose with your arm. Wear a face cloth/covering or a mask when possible.
- 6. Smile, nod, or wave to greet one another; refrain from shaking hands.
- 7. Earnestly pray for the Lord's mercy that the spread of the disease will be controlled; may the Lord heal the afflicted and bless those to have a full recovery, and may the Lord help those in times of trouble to overcome.
