### People are seeking the Lord

In the last 2 years of the pandemic, large numbers of people have come to faith in Christ and are being baptized in spite of persecution that starts from the moment of their new birth in Christ.



One young leader and his team baptized 36 people in the month of April. In many villages Christians are being told not to use the village ponds for baptism.



So here's one pastor's solution: In March he baptized 7 people in his water reservoir!! This leader is now leading two house fellowships and in June he baptized 6 more people!

Some house churches have been threatened and told to stop holding prayer and worship services.

One house church with normal attendance of 130 on Sundays, dropped down to 30 after these threats.

This leader organized 2 outreach events in June in 2 new villages and out of a total attendance or 120 people, 54 men and women accepted the Lord!

# **KOLKATA HOPE RISING IN THE SLUMS**

#### God is doing amazing things in KHRIS.

Two of our girls completed their BA graduate degrees and are now in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year MA programs despite the many disruptions during the last 2 years!

Imagine completing a 500 word project using a mobile phone to type out the essays. So 2021 was a year of trusting the Lord to provide laptops for the 2 young ladies in their MA programs and He did!



Here is Puja, an MA 2<sup>nd</sup> year student with her very first laptop, thanks to generous gifts from friends in Canada.

Another 2 girls are now in their BA program 2<sup>nd</sup> year and will be needing laptops as their assignments become too big to type out and print from their mobile phones.

Finally we have 1 young man ready to begin college 1<sup>st</sup> year! It has been hard to convince kids from the slums to complete their studies as economic conditions in their homes often force the parents to send these kids out to grab any job in order to provide an income, not realizing they consign their kids to a life of low income jobs.

Another huge blessing has been the provision of funds through KHRIS to acquire 5 units of housing for 5 families that are now off the streets and no longer in the slums!

And in its place a new home is being built to house her family of 6 who have never lived in a proper home before.

Their oldest daughter is now in her 3<sup>rd</sup> year Nurses training. Things are looking up for this family. Praise God!



God willing, when I am in Kolkata next month I will be looking at the possibility of acquiring a 6<sup>th</sup> unit to get one more family off the streets and out of the slums for good. Pray that this will be possible as Kolkata is facing such a massive shortage of housing that the Toronto practice of "bidding wars" is prevalent there and is driving prices up very rapidly.

Bengal is a land of hurricanes and floods. Villages gets inundated frequently with the heavy monsoon rains and some relief is almost always needed. In the midst of that, believers faithfully attend church services. The picture below is of some villagers heading to their house fellowships by boat!





Our house fellowships also handed out much needed food grains and other necessities during these hard times.

Much has happened recently and I thank God for granting me good health and strength to continue working with a faithful band of men and women leaders who lead over a hundred house churches spread out all over the province.
