Dear MCBC,

I am so thankful for you and your many prayers for me and the team. In spite of an extremely tiring summer full of sweaty children, we have had a wonderful summer of ministry! Over 450 children were able to attend summer camps throughout Ontario from Windsor to Ottawa, children from small towns to large cities.

There are two stories that especially stood out for me. The first one is with our church partner in Port Perry. Last year they signed up with us to organize a sports camp, but struggled mightily to get their community to engage and participate; however, this year they more than doubled their camp size and still had families on their waitlist. It is a reminder of how God goes forth in His work and draws people to Himself.

The second story comes from our partner in Paisley, Ontario. Paisley is a small

community northwest of Toronto near Lake Huron. Pastor Zach has mentioned that there were several churches in their community that have closed down in recent years, and the number of attendees continues to dwindle as the congregation ages. They have 35 people attending this church on a regular basis, and their average age is 70. They are really hoping this sports camp would revitalize the congregation and give them a new vision of what ministry in Paisley can be.

When I went up to Paisley on Friday as camp was wrapping up, the kids were enjoying their soccer game. I had the opportunity to speak with Pastor Zach, as well as some of the volunteers there. The feedback was tremendous and I was informed that several families from the camp said they would start attending church because of the soccer camp. Praise the Lord!! More importantly, the volunteers felt very empowered and realized that, regardless of their age, they have so much more to give to the Lord and to their community.

My heart is so full and I am so encouraged to hear we could build up a church to be salt and light in their community!


I am so thankful for your many prayers, these past several months had indeed been a test of my faith.

The hiring process has been especially challenging due to the amount of travel required for this position, and the pressure of upcoming camps was really getting to me. I tried my best to look for coaches, and what I got was a mixture of unqualified candidates and amazing candidates that would rather not travel.

As the camp season approached, I was feeling all the pressure of our partners and expectations from myself, while I also kept reminding myself to trust in God's timing and His providence. One thing I knew for sure was that God will provide in His right timing, but my reality was that until He had provided, the stress remained from knowing my coach positions were unfilled.

I praise God for His faithfulness! With much prayer and patience, God finally provided us with 5 coaches for this summer just in time for the camp season to begin. We have now completed our first week of camp in Strathroy, and the team has done a fantastic job in connecting with the children and serving the church community there!







Below are the 9 different camps we will be a part of this summer. As you can see, they are all across Ontario, from Ottawa all the way to Windsor and we will be ministering and sharing the gospel to over 450 children!

Matt's story made the gospel so real for me, gave me hope and encouraged me to share the gospel more because I never know how it could impact someone's life. I later found out Matt went home and began sharing what he had learned about God with his parents.

I prayed that Matt's curiosity in the gospel would open doors for his parents as well, and that they would come to know Christ.

Two brothers, Artem and Mark age 8 and 6 years old respectively, along with their younger sister and their parents, recently moved to Canada as refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine.

Artem and Mark do not speak any English, and Mark in particular had a difficult time adjusting to camp as he was very overwhelmed and only came for one day. Artem on the other hand continued to come to camp even though he did not speak any English. He was very brave and tried his best to fit in, and the other kids were very welcoming and gracious to Artem as well.

One of my favourite moments with Artem was when he tried to show me his portable electronic gaming system. While we could not communicate through language, he taught me the rules with hand signals, and I learned how to play with him and smiled a lot with Artem at the end.

There were times when I grew frustrated when he wouldn't understand instructions, but I am reminded of God's grace for me when I'm difficult or wouldn't understand. Meeting Artem and Mark was a great inspiration to me in my walk with Christ.

Merry Christmas and a happy new year to you!

Thank you for your faithful giving and many prayers for this ministry partnership, I certainly would not be able to continue on this ministry without you on this journey with me.

I pray that this past year has been good to you and you have seen God at work in your life. As I reflected on this past Advent season, I can see there is the excitement of celebrations - the sight of the lights and decorations, and the sound of family gatherings and presents opening. However, we know that for many people, this is a season of *loneliness*, *anxiety*, *and hurt* as well.

I pray that in the joy and the sorrows in these festivities, you will be able to experience God with you.



Having the time to clearly outline and focus my ministry moving forward to these 5 main areas.


- 1. <u>Camps</u> Summer sports camps for community outreach in partnership with churches and organizations.

- Administration Streamline our internal procedure regarding recruitment, connecting with our Campus and Pro division, and other administrative responsibilities.





Ministry Update

After months of uncertainties and over a year of waiting, the past several months had been packed with excitement and action.

Summer Camps - God gave us opportunities to run two camps in the third and fourth weeks of August. The first one was partnered with Northumberland <u>Promise</u>, an outreach organization located in Cobourg, Ontario. The second partner we had was Richmond Hill Free Methodist Church, a church located in Richmond Hill, Ontario.

Not only were these two camps challenging for me and my team, but it was also very reaffirming for our calling. In the Northumberland camp, we were able to present the gospel message and out of 60 children attending the camp, we had 19 campers respond to the call!

Connecting and Planning - These two camps allowed me to meet different people who are also passionate about the Lord and want to use sports as a way to connect with their community. The next steps are to connect and build solid relationships with these groups and see how AIA can be part of their ministry on a year-round basis.

While these two camps were so vastly different - culture, demographics, and just the overall organization of the camps - the one commonality that I took away from these two weeks was that both camps needed to hear about Jesus. So often we go into serving with an idea of what "ministry" should look like and how God should act, much like Jonah who decided ahead of time how God should deal with the people of Nineveh. It is very humbling to be reminded that we get to participate in what God is doing, even when it isn't what we imagined it to be.

Dear MCBC,

Hope you have been well! I have been praying for each of you and I trust that the Lord has been working in each of your lives. My deepest apologies for not sending this out earlier, it seems as though something urgent springs up every other day. There have been many ups and downs for me personally and I would like to take this opportunity to give you an update and connect with all of you.

Ministry Update

Have you ever been in a maze? You enter into this labyrinth of bushes and

every path looks similar and worth exploring, so you choose one and follow its path until all of a sudden you come to a dead-end, then you gotta change course and explore a different path until that comes to a dead end. The desire and urgency to arrive at the destination only fuel the frustration of time spent on a dead-end and the uncertainties of not knowing which path is the right path.

While no one could have foreseen Covid to shut everything down for the past 15 months, that has been my experience with Athletes in Action so far. Ministry feels like walking inside a giant maze, pursuing every path and running into dead-ends over and over again.

Although it has been a really frustrating season of ministry, several weeks ago the Lord met me in Scripture. While feeling really dejected from the everchanging Covid restrictions, I read in 1 Corinthians 15:58

"Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."

Timely as always, the Lord reminded me to hold firm to my calling and that my work and preparation are never wasted. The Lord will honour the work in His timing.

While organizing camps might not be going smoothly, I have not been idle with my time, below are some ministry updates.

Educational Courses - I recently completed two different courses in order to further equip myself. The first course was an 8 weeks course (once a week) with Sanctuary Mental Health. Our current lockdown has been affecting myself and many others, and it's such a useful tool for me to learn more about mental health and how to walk alongside others.

The second course I completed was a week-long course by Reframed Institute Canada, and it was a course on race/ethnicity/culture and biblical Oneness that Jesus prayed for in John 17. I found the course to be very helpful with understanding a little bit more about Canada's history, as well as having time and space to reflect on my own story as well. It has been a fruitful experience for me to appreciate my Asian culture as well as how that shapes my cultural lenses.

Regular Summer Camps Cancelled - We have decided to cancel all regular in-person camps for this summer once again. With the current third wave that we are experiencing, it would be unwise for us to proceed. Quite a number of our church partners decided not to proceed this summer and preferred to move online instead. We are constantly monitoring the health and safety guidelines with the hopes of running some in-person camps later this summer.

Currently, we are working with our church and community partners to plan for in-person camps whenever the opportunity arises in the event that Covid restriction loosens. There are many different elements that need to align for us to be able to host these camps, but nevertheless I will try my best to do what is needed.
